All outside supports are utilized to full capacity and are an integral piece to our planning. CESD Inclusive Ed Coordinator will support staff in programming and supports for students with diverse needs.  Staff members will use the supportive process (KITE) for the most vulnerable students.  Students will access Family School Wellness support, as needed.  Staff will have access to professional development in order to build capacity around social emotional well being.  Administrators and teachers will participate in the Social Emotional Well-being and Inclusion Leader Learning Series.  Educational Assistants within the School Division will participate in the Social Emotional Mell-being and Inclusion Educational Assistant Learning Series (Parabytes).  All Reed Ranch Staff will work towards SEW certification.	60% of CESD students will transition to post-secondary within 6 years of grade 10. Grade 1-6 students will write standardized assessments in reading using the provincially approved assessments:  Implementation of UFLI Foundations in K-2 classrooms.  Use of decodable text for developing readers.  Level A Assessment (F &P)  Grade 1-3 will also use Early Literacy Intervention reading data  Staff will program for intervention opportunities to work with striving readers, with a focus on push-in support when possible.	Each student will achieve an attendance rate of 90% or higher.  Examination of attendance data and its impact on student success. Work through a system of support with students and families to improve attendance.  K-12 flexible learning options will be available for students unable to attend full time in the regular classroom.  Anxiety strategies and supports will be offered to all students through the Mental Health Capacity Building Grant Program (K-8), and Family School Wellness Supports.	90% of CESD students will achieve 3-year High School Completion.
