A Message from the Superintendent

In Chinook's Edge, we are continually looking at different assessment tools which convey the great accomplishments of our students and staff. Although some traditional measures of student achievement have been disrupted because of COVID-19, we can continue to look at a number of other indicators when determining student success. A series of success measures are embedded in our division goals:

- Academic Excellence: we are able to refer to data from grade 3 student learning achievement tests, grade 6 & 9 Provincial Achievement Tests, grade 12 Diploma Exams, along with PowerTeacherPro Gradebook, student attendance and reading support level data, among other measures.
- **Career Connections**: our schools continue to refine their comprehensive plan of career exploration, planning and guidance for students in grades 9-12 and embed this work within school cultures.
- **Social Emotional Well-being**: school staff are utilizing our social emotional framework and our collaborative response model, along with a new vision for supporting students in the early years, to ensure the needs of all students are being met.

Among all the checks and balances in place, we believe success can also be measured in the resilience that our students have shown as they have made the shift to learning online as needed. We understand that not all families have access to adequate internet in the home, and we know parents are trying their best to support their child when they are required by COVID-19 restrictions to learn online from home periodically. Kindergarten News:

Here we are once again at the start of yet another month...March!! The time just flies by for us each week. Our kindergarten year is going well so far and we are enjoying our time learning so many wonderful things! Hope you all had a nice break. This month we will be starting our dinosaur theme. The Dinosaur theme is always such a fun theme for us with so many things to learn!

<u>Math -</u> We will continue to work on recognizing, building, drawing, and printing numbers from 0 to 10. The kids will continue subitizing numbers 1-5 and will move towards 6-10. Subitizing means being able to recognize numbers at a glance without counting. Kids can practice this with dice or playing cards. A recommended App is: dominoes easy match (free). Playing games like Snakes and Ladders, Crazy 8's, Uno, War, and Dominoes are also great ideas!

Language Arts- we are starting to learn about rhyming. We will be using books, poems, games, chants, songs and various activities to encourage this concept. Rhyming is an important component of phonological awareness and reading. Please continue to help your child at home with letter/sound recognition.

<u>Social Studies</u> – We will start learning about 'My Home, My School, My Community'!

Please remember to read your child's Read at Home Books and library book with them each week. This is an important time for your child. Thank you for your continued support. You are appreciated!

#### Mrs. West's Grade 1 and 2 Class

In Language Arts, we are learning about polar bears. The students are also working on their printing skills, writing in complete sentences, word families and reading books at their level. The grade ones and twos are continuing the program called Making Words. Making Words is an activity in which children are individually given some letters and use these letters to make words. During this activity, children make approximately 15 words, beginning with two-letter words and continuing with three, four, five-letter and bigger words until the final word is made. The final word (a six, seven, or eight –letter word) always includes all the letters they have that day. Making Words is an active, hands-on, manipulative activity in which children discover lettersound relationships and learn how to look for patterns in words. They also learn that changing just one letter or even the sequence of the letters changes the whole word.

In Math, we are learning about addition and subtraction.

In Science, we are learning about liquids. .

In Social Studies, the students are learning the cultural and linguistic characteristics of an Inuit, an Acadian and a Prairie community in Canada.

Mrs. West's Grade 1, 2 and 3 Class

In Health, the students are learning about emotions and how to self-regulate. They are also learning the characteristics of being a good friend.

**Language Arts:** We are beginning our second novel study on "Owls in the Family", by Farley Mowat. This is a very fun story about a boy who adopts 2 owls as pets!

**Math:** We are finishing our division unit and will be moving on to understanding and working with fractions and decimals.



**Social Studies:** We will be continuing our look at different countries in the world by exploring Ukraine. We will be looking at the geography, culture and economics of Ukraine and comparing them to Alberta.

**Science:** We are continuing our unit on building and will be moving into designing and building our own containers, bridges and more!
