

A message from the Superintendent

In Chinook's Edge, we know that creating a positive social-emotional culture in our schools will significantly impact the well-being and achievement of both students and staff. We care deeply about this priority and the entire division is engaged in creating SEW supportive classrooms. Social Emotional Well-being (SEW) has been a key divisional goal for us for several years.

Under the direction of Dr. Marcie Perdue, Associate Superintendent of Student Services, Chinook's Edge has developed a series of training sessions for school leaders, teachers and support staff. The focus of these sessions is to promote universal social emotional strategies, such as focusing on the classroom environment and using visuals to support classroom routines. The training also focuses on the importance of developing emotional vocabulary and self awareness. The strategies are being shared through training to all division staff who work directly with students: teachers, educational assistants and school administrators. A highlight of the training sessions was recognizing key characteristics which capture the most impactful social emotional classroom environment.

This determined focus, to bring social emotional well-being supports to life in every school, will help students and staff reach their full potential. When everyone in our school communities are met each morning knowing they are welcome, safe, cared for and respected, they are more open to learning, leading and succeeding.

Happy New Year to my Kindergarten, Grade 1 & 2 Families! I hope you all had a wonderful-relaxing holiday! I am looking forward to settling back into our classroom routines and learning lots of new things this month.

Kindergarten:

<u>*Language Arts:</u> We will continue to learn about our letters of the alphabet and the sounds associated with them and continue to work hard in our printing books practicing the printing strategies learned thus far. We will be sharing winter stories to practice retelling and sequencing events in a story. The story <u>The Mitten</u> will be our main focus to have the students retell a familiar story.

*In a few weeks I will be starting our Read At Home Program.

<u>*In Social Studies:</u> We will continue the unit on "Being Unique" through discussions, stories, sharing, and drawing.

*In Math: We will finish our unit on patterns and start to work on 'Number Recognition'.

Grade 1 /2:

*Language Arts: This month I will really be jumping into reading for both Grade 1 and 2!! You should begin to see improvements in your child's reading and the use of various strategies they have learned so far to decode words as they read. Reading is a personal journey and every student will get there when they are ready! However, I strongly encourage you to PLEASE remember to take a few minutes to read the READ AT HOME books/library books with your child each day...and continue to work on their sight words. This is a great way to build on their reading AND writing skills:)

This month my <u>Grade 1 students</u> will continue learning new sight words and will continue to learn how to use reading strategies while using their leveled books. We will also be continuing to learn how to form simple sentences. This month my <u>Grade 2 students</u> will continue to develop their reading strategies, continue with sight word practice as well learning how to develop good sentences.

In <u>both</u> Grade 1 and 2 we will continue improving our reading and writing skills as we work daily on our sight words and writing activities through Daily 4!!

*Math: We are continuing to develop our understanding of numbers to 100 and explore skip counting and counting forwards and backwards(2, 5, 10 etc)

<u>*Science:</u> We will complete our Hot and Cold Temperatures unit.

<u>*Social Studies:</u> We will continue working on the unit "Belonging in the World and Groups We Belong To."
